



Lambourn's new 'Kurtsystem' has the potential to revolutionise horse racing

The innovative system cost Turkish industrialist Mehmet Kurt £40m to develop
The six-furlong round monorail has cabins with berths for up to 12 horses
Kurt believes his system will enhance muscle and skeletal development
The capacity to measure heart rate, lung capacity and gait will also be fitted
